Students have a folder in Drive called Notability.

FAQs:

Where can I see my child's homework assignments?

Homework assignments can be found in the Schoology Calendar. Please remember that sometimes assignments/tests may be posted on the day they are due.

How do Schoology and Notability work together?

When a teacher gives a student a digital handout, the teacher will post that document in Schoology, but the student will download it to Notability. Once the document is in Notability, students can write on it, type, add photos, drawings and more. Therefore, if you are looking for your child's completed notes, or other documents you will find them organized in Notability. Notability is their digital binder/notebook.

My child was absent how can I know what he/she missed?

Each teacher posts a daily agenda for their class. On Schoology, you can view the daily agenda for his/her courses to see a general idea of what was covered that day and what materials they might need to pick up upon return to school. Please also make sure your student checks in with his/her teacher.

To help your child use their resources effectively at home, ask the following questions:

1. Was the resource on Schoology?
2. Did you put the document in Notability?
3. Where can you find more information about the assignment?
4. Did you check the agenda? Did you check the calendar? Did you check that unit folder in Schoology? Did you check that unit folder in Notability?
